# **Transfer Student Checklist**

# **1. Understand your transfer credit**

How many credits have been transferred to your UBC degree? (Log in to the SSC to find the answer)

Year level is determined by the number of credits.

# 2. Identify your program (major)

If you are entering UBC as a third-year student, you must declare or apply for your major before registering for courses. <u>Browse Arts program options.</u>

# For competitive, application-required programs:

# 3. Understand Bachelor of Arts Degree Requirements

Be sure to check out the other <u>degree requirements</u> (Language, Science, Research, Literature) that you must fulfill to complete your Bachelor of Arts degree. Use your <u>Degree Navigator</u> report to see if you've met some of these requirements already with your transfer credit!

# 4. Get Ready for Registration

You'll receive an email about two weeks before registration opens to let you know that your specific registration date is posted on the <u>Student Services Centre (SSC)</u>. You can register any time between your <u>registration open date</u> and the <u>course change (add/drop) deadline</u> in September.
